## Perspective Taking Board Game

**To Play**: Print, preferably on card stock quality paper, and laminate. Use any small object as game pieces and either a spinner from another game or a die. I like to grab old board games that are being given away or sold for very little money at yard sales and keep the game pieces/dice/spinners, just for this situation © Students determine how many spaces they will move and read the text on the space they land on. Depending on the color of the space, they answer one of three questions, related to the given scenario;

**What Can You Do?** {Encourage students to think about something they could do or say in the given scenario}

What Are They Feeling? {Encourage students to think about how someone might feel in the given scenario}

What Are They Thinking? {Encourage students to think about what someone might be thinking in the given scenario}

\*Want a challenge? Have students select a card to answer one more question about the space they landed on {and move forward one bonus space} or, have your students answer all three questions{and move forward 3 spaces}.
